

How to be the best dressed celebrant there is

When a bride and groom are looking for a celebrant, how will they choose you?

Being well groomed is a no brainer

The first obvious thing is to make sure that your outfits are tailored and that shoes are polished. Hair and make-up and nails etc., for the women should be very well presented. You are better to spend a little bit of money on a few great quality and great fitting garments, than have a lot of poorer fitting outfits. You can wear the same outfit to many weddings.

Being colour co-ordinated is the best way to look your best

Having a one off colour consultation will determine what colours suit you. These colours will make you look younger, slimmer, more vibrant and professional and well groomed. Some tones just don't suit certain people and can make them look dull ,drab, tired and heavy.

Just like everyone else in the party, being colour coordinated is the way to look your best and to know you look fabulous every time you officiate at a wedding.

Building a working wardrobe around your colours will have you looking younger, fresher and more attractive.

You will find that you will have more choice of outfits as well, as your wardrobe will be more coordinated, and be able to mix and match.

It is best to stick to the colours in your palette, that are in keeping with the colours in the bridal party, so that you don't dominate the wedding photos. Soft neutrals and pastels suit some celebrants and will work in most cases. Some people suit stronger tones. In that case a soft grey or silver, if that flows with the colours of the group would look great.

Do not use bright colours or quirky outfits or prints. You are not the feature of the show and it detracts from your professionalism.
